## Wildflower Top 10

Saturday 20th June 10 am - 3 pm

Location: Flatts Lane Country Park, nr Eston



If you love wild flowers but are struggling with the field guides, then this is the workshop for you. We will demystify flower identification, with tips on the best field guides and sneaky shortcuts that will enable you to tackle wildflower identification with greater confidence. By the end of the day you will be able to recognise members of 10 different plant families. Aimed at beginners or those with a little experience.

#### **Bee Walker**

Sunday 19th July 10 am - 4 pm

Location: Stewart Park, Middlesbrough

An introduction to these fascinating vital insects, exploring their life cycle, behaviour and role in the environment. The Bumblebee Conservation Trust will be guiding us through their Bee Watch and Bee Walk surveys and how to provide habitats for them in urban green places. This is a rare opportunity to receive training from a national charity that is devoted to the conservation of bumblebees.

#### **Great Guided Walks**

Top tips on how to share your wildlife sites with other people, focusing on making your walks a little bit more fun and certainly memorable. Walk planning, health and safety and techniques to engage people of all ages and abilities will all be covered.

Its not just squirrels that are secretive. Many species of mammal can be found in the town and surrounding countryside and most do their best not to be seen but all leave some signs of their presence. Turn detective for the day and learn to recognise some of the clues that help us identify them, even if we seldom see them. No prior knowledge required.
