Pupils from Abbey Hill School - Sheraton spent some time helping the Tees Valley Wildlife Trust to improve the reserve. They also did their John Muir Award.

We planted some reeds to help to filter the pond and to create a habitat for animals to live in.

It also creates an area for nesting birds.

We also spent the day learning how to use loppers to cut down over hanging branches so people don't get hurt.

We did a litter pick and we found lots of dog poo, which was minging and it made us feel sick.
